CAMPING

There will be security patrols to ensure that camping fees are paid. It is unfair when people who have paid are disadvantaged by those who have not.

- You must book, application forms will be sent to you once your horse has been accepted.
- Total charge is \$150 per powered site, \$65 per unpowered site and \$3 per person for all or part of the Show. (All camping charges are GST inclusive).
- Maximum of one truck or one car plus one horse float per site. Each vehicle will be issued with a non transferable permit.
- On arrival at the Show, each camper will surrender their gate pass and be issued with a plastic wristband (to be worn 24 hours per day). Camping officials will show you to your site on arrival.

STABLING BY - LAWS

ALL STABLING ENQUIRIES WILL BE ACCEPTED BY FAX OR MAIL ONLY.

STABLING SUPERVISOR HOURS DURING SHOW:

STRICTLY NO ENTRY BEFORE 12:00 NOON ON MONDAY 23 FEBRUARY 2009

1. Because the number and type of stables on the grounds are limited the allocation and supervision of stabling shall be the responsibility of the Stabling Committee.
2. Horses normally stabled within a 50km radius of the Exhibition Park will not qualify for accommodation.
3. Exhibitors seeking stables should apply for the type of stables desired, consistent with the performance of the animal concerned, in the space indicated on the entry form.
5. **DO NOT FORWARD STABLING FEES WITH ENTRY FORM.**
6. Stabling will be allocated by the Stabling Committee after the Closing of Entries date of 15 October 2008. Exhibitors will then be informed by mail of their allocated stables. Exhibitors will have **21 (twenty one) days from the date of allocation** to forward payment for stabling as advised by the Society. Failure to forward payment in the required time limit will result in **automatic cancellation of stable allocation.**

Stabling charges will be as follows :

- a. Loose Boxes - \$30.00 per day commencing at 6.00pm
 - b. Covered Stalls - \$25.00 per day commencing at 6.00pm
 - c. Yards - \$10.00 per day commencing at 6.00pm
7. **Stables are allocated to specific animals and are not transferable.**
 8. ALL stabling is to be cleaned by the occupant by 8.00am daily. Bedding straw is not provided but may be purchased on the ground.
 9. **Allocated stables not taken up by 6.00pm each day will be reallocated.**
 10. **REFUNDS** - 50% of Stabling fees will be refunded if the stabling is cancelled before Monday 23 February 2009 at 2pm.
Cancellations will be accepted by fax or mail only.
 11. **NO ELECTRIC FENCES** are allowed on the Show grounds.
 12. Exhibitors who have a stable/yard allocation and do not notify the Society **IN WRITING** of their non-attendance at the ActewAGL Royal Canberra Show **will be responsible for the cost** of the stables/yards allocated.

EXHIBITION BY-LAWS

1. ADVERTISING

No advertising matter of any description or any mark or sign indicating ownership or identity will be permitted on any exhibit being judged or whilst in the arena.

2. AGE OF EXHIBITORS

The age of Junior Riders will be as at the first day of the Show, Wednesday 25 February 2009. All Junior riders must compete in an approved safety helmet.

3. AGGRESSIVE ANIMALS

Aggressive or uncontrollable behaviour by any horse while under the control of the marshalling stewards or while competing in the arena will render the exhibit liable for disqualification from the class or classes concerned and from acceptance for entry at future Shows conducted by the Society.

4. ANIMAL IDENTIFICATION

Registration/Horse identification certificates must be shown on request and copies must accompany entries.

5. ANIMAL SECURITY

Where an Exhibitor fails to properly secure any animal and bodily injury or property damage occurs this may constitute a serious breach of insurance policy conditions and prejudice claims settlement.

6. APPLICATION FOR ENTRY

- a. Must be made in writing on forms supplied by the Society and be accompanied by entry fees.
- b. must be lodged with the Secretary prior to the closing date for entries as specified on the schedule cover.
- c. Entries received after the closing date as specified in the schedule, or entries received unaccompanied by the specified entry fees or registration papers will not be accepted.
- d. **Facsimile or telephone entries are not acceptable.**
- e. Entries may be made online at www.rncas.org.au, to be accompanied by suitable credit card payment.

7. CANCELLATION OF THE SHOW

It is agreed between the parties that, if in the sole discretion of the Directors or the Chief Executive Officer or some other authorised officer that the Show is to be partially or fully cancelled for any reason whatsoever, the exhibitor shall not pursue the Society for the recoveries of lost income or damages. This complete bar to an action applies to all headings of Law, whether it be Common Law in Contract or Tort or pursuant to any State, Territorial, or Commonwealth Statute Law. It is acknowledged by the exhibitor that the Society has no duty to have a Show in any particular year and that this Clause operates as a complete defence for the Society to any such action.

8. CONTROL OF SHOW

The Board, CEO or other such authorised representative of the Society shall have the power without assigning any reason to:

- (i) Reject or cancel any entry any time;
- (ii) Prohibit the participation by any person or exhibit in any event or class for which it is entered;
- (iii) Cancel any event or class;
- (iv) Alter the time at which any class or event is to take place;
- (v) Alter the conditions of any event;
- (vi) Remove any exhibit from Exhibition Park in Canberra;
- (vii) Alter the date or time for the closing of entries for any section or class or for any particular entry;
- (viii) Transfer an exhibit or exhibitor from any class to any other class.

The exhibitor shall at all times comply with the directions or requests of the Council, CEO or other such authorised representative of the Society. This shall without limiting the generality of the foregoing apply to the entry, the animal, the exhibitor, the conditions of the event, the conduct of the exhibitor, the conducting of the event, the decisions of the Judge and the awarding of the prize.

The Board, CEO or other such authorised representative of the Society reserve the right to adjudicate on any entry or upon any question in dispute or doubt and to make any determination upon any matter whether covered by the conditions of entry or not and the decision so made shall be final and binding and the Society shall thereby have sole and absolute control of all matters affecting the conduct of the Show and the exhibits and exhibitors. There shall be no right of appeal to any court of law or other body from any decision made by the Board, CEO or other such authorised representative of the Society.

The R.N.C.A.S. reserves the right to rule at any time that any exhibit, exhibitor or competitor may not compete. This right remains notwithstanding the Society's acceptance of entry, its inclusion in the Society's catalogue or the issue by the Society of an exhibit ticket, number or any other document.

9. CHIEF HORSE STEWARD

The powers of the Society, its Board and its Chief Executive Officer described in these By-Laws have been delegated, in the respect of the Horse Section, to the Chief Horse Steward.

10. ENTER AT OWN RISK

The exhibitor enters entirely at his own risk. In case any exhibit whilst on the Society Showgrounds shall cause or be the cause of injury or damage to any other exhibit or exhibitor or to the personal property of any member of the Society or the general public, the owner of such exhibit shall indemnify and keep indemnified the Society, its officers, officials and members from and against all damages, costs, claims, expenses or liabilities incurred in connection with such exhibits. The exhibitor shall be liable to the Society and its employees, officers and officials for any damage or loss occasioned to any of them by the exhibit or the exhibitor or his agent.

11. ENTRY FEES

Entrance Fees and compulsory drug levies must accompany all entries, and no rebate or refunds are permitted to be given to competitors by the Society, vide By-Laws of the Southern Highlands Show Societies' Union, Group 7.

12. ENTRY FEE REFUNDS

- a. Exhibitors who subsequently are unable to exhibit and who advise the Society in writing on the Withdrawal Form provided, no later than 31 January 2009 will be refunded 50% of entry fees. The maximum amount retained by the Society in relation to this clause will be \$150.
- b. There is no refund for notification of withdrawal after 31 January 2009.
- c. In the event of exhibits not being accepted 50% of entry fees will be refunded.

13. ENTRY LIMITATIONS

Competitors in **Showjumping** are limited to 3 (three) entries in any one class.

14. ENTRY RESTRICTION

Restrictions or limitations on the number of entries in any section may be made by Chief Horse Steward.

15. FIRE REGULATIONS

No Smoking in Horse Stalls or Pavilions. Primus stoves or naked lights are not permitted in Horse Stalls or Pavilions.

16. GATE PASSES

Exhibitors will be allocated passes on the following scale:

1-3 Horses	-	2 Passes
4-5 Horses	-	3 Passes
6 or more Horses-		4 Passes

17. GRAND PARADES

- a. **It is the condition of entry into the Royal Canberra Show that every exhibit is required to take part in the Grand Parade on the Arena at the times set out in the printed program. Failure to parade will entail a penalty of \$100 (per exhibit), forfeiture of prize money, awards, and/or non-acceptance at any subsequent Royal Canberra Shows.**
- b. Led exhibits must not be rugged.
- c. Each exhibit shall wear its exhibit (breast plate) number and riders of horses shall wear formal or hacking attire.
- d. No ribbons may be worn on exhibits or competitors other than those won during the current Show.

18. GROUND CLEANING LEVY

A compulsory ground cleaning levy of **\$10 PER EXHIBIT** will be charged.

19. JUDGING:

- a. The society accepts no responsibility if the judging time happens to conflict with one or more classes or events.
- b. The Judges decision is final.
- c. Champions and Reserve Champions: First prize winners only are eligible for judging. Reserve Champions will be selected from remaining first prize winners and the second prize winner from the class that provided the champion.

20. LIABILITY FOR EXHIBITS

The Society shall not be responsible for the loss of or for any damage or injury occasioned to any exhibit or the property of any exhibitor from any cause whatsoever.

21. LOCAL EXHIBITORS

Local or district means the exhibit must reside within a radius of 50km from the Showgrounds.

22. MARSHALLING:

- a. Exhibitors and competitors shall be present in the marshalling yard and be ready to be judged at least 10 minutes prior to the time specified in the timetable for judging of the event.
- b. Three calls only will be made to the marshalling yard - two warning calls then the final call.
- c. Late competitors and exhibits will only be allowed to enter the arena at the Chief Horse Steward's discretion.
- d. Ridden Classes Rider Only and Led Classes Handler Only will be permitted in the Marshalling Area.

23. MEASURING/IDENTIFICATION

All horses entered in height classes must be measured /identified by the Official Measurer before competing.

Horses will not be measured unless the breast plate is produced to the Official Measurer.

Any Exhibitor who by himself or any agent:

- (a) directly or indirectly presents a horse which has an identity other than its true identity,
- (b) does any act or thing which is likely to result in a horse being incorrectly identified,
- (c) does any act or thing which is likely to result in a horse being incorrectly measured, or
- (d) presents a horse for measuring when the horse has had any Prohibited Substance administered to it,

Is automatically disqualified from exhibiting in any Class at the Show.

The RNCAS may, in its discretion and without assigning any reason, refuse to measure any horse presented for measuring if, in its opinion, the horse is not in a fit or proper condition to be measured or, in its opinion, any circumstances exist which are likely to lead to the horse being incorrectly measured.

The RNCAS may in its discretion request that a horse be swabbed.

Any amendment to the height appearing on the breast plate may only be made by the Official Measurer.

When measuring a horse, an allowance of up to 1cm or 3/8 inch may be made for shoes.

A horse will be transferred to another Class if it is determined by the Official Measurer to be over or under height for the Class for which it has been entered.

Horses presented for measuring at the measuring box must be suitably bitted.

A horse presented for measuring will be allowed a maximum of fifteen minutes in the measuring box before being measured. Should the exhibitor request a further period of time before being measured, one further period of fifteen minutes maximum will be permitted, at a later time.

At the conclusion of this second period of measure the horse's breast plate will be stamped with the horse's height as determined by the Official Measurer.

- a. Measuring times are as follows:

Tuesday	12.00pm - 6.00pm
Wednesday	8.00am - 6.00pm
Thursday	7.00am - 12.00pm 2.00pm - 6.00pm
Friday	7.00am - 10.00am 1.00pm - 2.00pm
Saturday	7.00am - 10.00am
Sunday	7.00am - 9.00am 1.00pm - 2.00pm
- b. Registration papers of each exhibit must be produced for identification purposes at the time of measuring.
- c. EFA/Hack council certificates may be accepted.

24. MEMBERS ENTRY FEE CONCESSION

Financial members of the RNCAS may claim a 20% reduction on total entry fees where total of entry fees are \$30.00 or more. (Stabling charge and ground cleaning levy not included, **reduction not applicable to associate members**).

25. MISREPRESENTATION OF EXHIBITS

Proved wilful misrepresentation of exhibits will not merely forfeit the prize, but render the exhibitor liable to be disqualified from exhibiting at future Shows of the Society. The onus of proof as to the bona fides will rest upon the exhibitor.

26. NON EXHIBITION OF ANIMALS

Every horse entered and not withdrawn by Wednesday 25 February must be exhibited unless a Withdrawal Form signed by the exhibitor or his authorised agent is lodged with the Society before the close of all judging stating that the animal is unable to compete for one of the following reasons:

- a. the animal has died
- b. the animal is unfit for exhibition due to injury or disease (confirmed by a Veterinary Surgeon's Certificate)
- c. the horse has become ineligible for the class entered and an application for transfer has not been lodged
- d. some other cause considered reasonable by the Society.
- e. Every horse entered and not exhibited must have a Withdrawal Form lodged by the completion of judging on the Sunday.

Exhibitors who do not comply with this by law will be penalised \$100.00 for each entry not exhibited. Non-payment of penalties may debar said persons from entering or exhibiting at future Royal Canberra Shows.

27. NUMBERING OF EXHIBITS

- a. Numbers corresponding to the number in the catalogue must be worn by each exhibit (except Showjumping) when appearing before the Judge. Exhibit numbers must be collected from the Ring Secretary's office.
- b. Breast plate numbers must be worn by horse exhibits and armband numbers by riding competitors.
- c. Ring stewards will ensure that all exhibits paraded before the judge are eligible to compete in the class are wearing the number shown in the official catalogue and class card. Exhibits not recorded in the official catalogue or

class card will not be judged. If name is not listed in catalogue check with Ring Secretary.

28. OFFENSIVE BEHAVIOUR

All persons causing annoyance by;

- a. Making loud comments, or by other offensive behaviour, on the decisions of Judges, Stewards or other officials; or
- b. The use of swearing or foul language will after being cautioned by the Board, CEO or other such authorised representative, be expelled from the ground and if a competitor, be liable for disqualification and forfeiture of any prize money won.

29. OWNERSHIP OF EXHIBITS

All exhibits must be the bona fide property of exhibitors. No two or more exhibitors shall exhibit co-jointly unless they are actual partners.

30. PERFORMANCE

Performance must be given on the entry form for each horse or pony nominated. Nominations in stated classes for horses will not be accepted without recognised performance. List only one performance per Show, a maximum of 1 Hack Council/EFA affiliated Show performance will be accepted.

A qualifying performance must be achieved at recognised Shows in the 12 months prior to the closing of entries. From the information contained on the Performance Form the Society will, at its discretion, determine which entries are to be accepted.

31. PONY CLUB CLASSES

(Run under rules of Pony Club Assoc of NSW:)

- a. Proof of age and membership to be made available on request for officials on the day of the event.
- b. Entries will be accepted from approved Pony Clubs affiliated with a Pony Club Association.
- c. Team Events - A team shall consist of riders under 25 years of age on the first day of the Show, Wednesday 25 February 2009 unless otherwise specified and shall be restricted to bona fide members of the same Pony Club Association.
- d. A horse must be the property of a member of the Club to which the rider belongs for a period of at least one month prior and one month after the fixture. Such proof to be supplied if called upon, and a breach to carry the penalty of disqualification for 12 months.
- e. **Entries must be lodged by the Club Secretary or a responsible official authorised to sign for the Club. NOT INDIVIDUALLY.**
- f. Dress - Shirt, tie, jodhpurs, approved safety helmet and elastic sided boots.
- g. Money - No money prizes will be awarded.

32. PRIZE MONEY

- a. All prize money will be paid by the Horse Secretary at the Ring Secretary's Office from 4pm to 6pm on each day of the show. Instructions on prize money cards must be observed.
- b. Prize money will only be paid to the person in whose name the entry is made.

- c. Prize money for Classes judged on Saturday and Sunday will not be paid until after the Grand Parades held on each of the above days.
- d. **Prize money unclaimed by 6.00pm on final day of Show will be forfeited.**
- e. If due to unforeseen circumstances sponsorship is not forthcoming for classes in which the prize money is sponsored, prize money will be paid by the R.N.C.A.S. at the amount that is printed in the relevant section of the schedule.
- f. **1st Prize money only will be paid for classes with 5 or less competitors competing in the event.**

33. PRIZE MONEY AND THE GST

All prize money quoted in the schedule is inclusive of the GST. **An official GST/Prize money Declaration form must be completed and returned with all entries.**

34. PROTESTS

All protests must be delivered to the Ring Secretary's no later than 1 hour after the event, after which no protest will be entertained. Each protest must be in writing and accompanied by a fee of \$50.00, which will be forfeited at the discretion of the Board, CEO or other such authorised representative if they consider the protest frivolous. Protests will be dealt with by the protest committee as soon as practicable after the receipt thereof.

35. RED COATS/STEWARDS

During Shows conducted by the RNCAS the failure of an exhibitor to comply with directives issued by a Red Coat escorting Classes into or out of the Arena, or Horse Section (Ring Steward) official shall automatically render the exhibitor involved, liable for disqualification and for non acceptance of entry at future Royal Canberra Shows.

36. REPLACEMENT OF AN EXHIBIT

The replacement of an exhibit entered in a class, with a substitute exhibit is NOT permitted.

37. SCHEDULE CONDITIONS

Conditions printed in the Schedule relative of class or group of classes will be observed.

38. STALLIONS:

- a. Stallions entering the arena must be under the control of an experienced handler, rider or driver, 17 years or over, with the exception of Shetland ponies, miniature horses & miniature ponies.
- b. Stallions are eligible to compete in harness classes for Driven Stallions only.
- c. All Stallions or Colts 1 year and over competing in led classes MUST be shown in a bit.

39. SUITABILITY OF ATTIRE

Riders, drivers and contestants must be suitably attired. A rider, driver or contestant not suitably attired shall be precluded by the Society from competing in any event. Riders, drivers and contestants shall wear at all times when in the Main Arena whether during the Grand Parades or otherwise the same or similar attire as is worn in the judging ring in which they or the animals of which they are in charge were exhibited. **Tennis and gym type shoes are not permitted.**

No long boots to be worn by Riders under 17 competing in riding classes.

40. TESTS AND SWABBING

The Board, CEO or other such authorised representative may make or cause to be made any test of any exhibit to determine whether any drug or stimulant has been administered to such exhibit for any of the following purposes and detain such horse for such period as is deemed necessary. A compulsory drug testing levy per horse will apply and is incorporated within class entry fees. It is the intention of these regulations that all animals shall perform on their merits without the aid of drugs which will affect the conduct, performance or appearance of the animal.

An exhibitor shall not administer and shall procure that there shall not be administered to his exhibit any drug or substance herein call "a prohibited drug".

Prohibited drugs are substances originating externally whether or not they are endogenous to the animal and means any performance or behaviour of an animal by its action upon the central or peripheral nervous system, the cardiovascular system, the respiratory system, the alimentary digestive system, the musculoskeletal system or the urogenital system and shall include analgesics, anti-histamines, anti-inflammatory agents, blood coagulants, diuretics, hormones and their synthetic counterparts, cortico-steroids, anabolic steroids, local anaesthetics, muscle relaxants and tranquillisers and vitamins. The use of antibiotic substances (anti-viral, anti-microbial, anti-parasitic) with the exception of Procaine Penicillin may be permitted.

The Society may at its discretion cause an examination to be made of an exhibit by a Veterinary Officer who in the course of such examination may make by such methods as he may determine such tests of and take such samples from such exhibit as he deems necessary or advisable. The result of such examination shall be reported to the Society.

An exhibit to which, in the opinion of a Veterinary Officer, a prohibited drug has been administered shall not be exhibited without consent of the Society and shall be removed from the Showground forthwith upon notice from the Society.

The Society may in its sole discretion and in the light of all information made available to it disallow or cancel the entry and any award made to the exhibit, without in such case being called upon to give any reason therefore.

The owner or any other person who was in charge of an animal to which a prohibited drug has been administered may be disqualified or otherwise penalised by the Society. Any person who at any time administers or causes to be administered for the purpose of affecting the performance of an animal in any event or class at the Show any drug as defined above or has in his possession any improper contrivance may be disqualified or otherwise penalised by the Society. Particular attention will be paid to the detection of sedative and tranquilliser groups of drugs but analysis for all classes of prohibited substances will be included. The collection of samples inter alia will always involve taking urine and/or blood.

An examination may include an examination for desensitised limbs. Any animal found to have a limb or part of a limb

desensitised by any means will be considered to have competed under the influence of a prohibited substance and penalised accordingly.

The owner or his representative may be present during testing (in the case of Showjumping or Dressage Horses the rider must be present and becomes the authorised representative in accordance with FEI rules) but shall not interfere in any way with the conduct of the test, and will observe the instructions of the veterinary officer on duty. In the absence of the exhibitor and/or owner the Society recognises the rider, and/or handler and/or driver as the authorised agent of the exhibitor.

The Society and any servant or appointee of the Society shall not be liable to the exhibitor, owner or other interested parties, for the death of, or for any injury, damage or infection which may be sustained by an exhibit occasioned by or arising out of any act or omission of any servant, agent or appointee of the Society done or committed in the course of his examination whether due to the negligence of any such servant, agent or appointee or otherwise.

Any exhibit which has been brought to the Showgrounds and is found by the Board, CEO or other such authorised representative to have had administered a drug as defined above, the owner and any person who is in charge of the horse may be disqualified or otherwise penalised by the Society. Any person who at any time administers or causes to be administered for the purpose of affecting the performance of a horse in any event or class at the Show any drug defined above, or improper contrivance may be disqualified or otherwise penalised by the Society.

41. TIME OF ARRIVAL

All exhibits to be on the ground not later than when specified in the schedule. Entry tickets are forwarded by the Secretary.

42. TRANSFER & RE CLASSIFICATION

- a. Should a horse be found by the Official Measurer to be over or under the height stipulated for the class in which it has been entered, the owner may lodge an application in writing on the form provided with the Ring Secretary to

have the entry transferred to a corresponding horse class in which the exhibit is eligible to compete.

- b. Should a horse cease to be eligible to compete in the class or classes entered for any reason other than height, an application for transfer or re-classification may be made in writing to the Ring Secretary for decision by the Chief Horse Steward or Deputy on duty.
- c. Should the eligibility of a horse to compete in a class in which an entry has been accepted, be questioned prior to the judging of the class the Ring Secretary and/or Ring Steward will so advise the Chief Horse Steward or his Deputy on duty before the judging of the class is completed.
- d. Judges and Ring Stewards are not authorised to consider applications for transfer or re-classification or to make any additions or alterations to information contained on official class cards.

43. VEHICLE PERMIT

Every vehicle entering the Showgrounds will require a vehicle permit. Campers will be issued with vehicle permits as part of their camping fee.

UNAUTHORISED PARKING WILL BE POLICED.

44. CHAMPIONSHIP COMPETITIONS

Competitors who have multiple entries eligible for championship competitions will be permitted to compete with each of their exhibits.

Competitors must present their exhibits with properly attired riders in to the ring, and will be permitted to change onto their other horses for their individual workouts.

Competitors should advise the Red Coats and Ring Stewards to allow for an orderly display of their exhibits.

45. TRANSPORT

Horse transports will not be permitted to leave Exhibition Park until after the Grand Parade on Saturday and Sunday unless an exemption form has been obtained from the Chief Horse Steward

STAY SAFE AT THE ActewAGL ROYAL CANBERRA SHOW

The Royal National Capital Agricultural Society is committed in providing a safe environment for all participants and spectators at the ActewAGL Royal Canberra Show.

Equestrian activities have one of the highest risks of serious injury and death compared with other sports, including motorcycle and car racing. Common sense and caution is needed when in the vicinity of horses. Please read the following to ensure a safe visit to the ActewAGL Royal Canberra Show.

Helmets

The wearing of protective headgear has been proved to have a major influence on the reduction of horse related injuries and the use of a properly fitted and fastened helmet when riding horses is compulsory. The current standard is AS/NZS 3838 and is advised to be worn at all times whilst mounted. Helmets should be replaced after any moderate to severe blows or after the recommended replacement time specified in the information provided with the helmet. It is recommended that children involved with horses should wear a helmet at all times, mounted or unmounted.

Footwear

Sturdy boots must always be worn around horses. Human feet are easily crushed by a horse's weight if trodden on. Whilst mounted, riding boots should be smooth soled, heeled and with elastic siding, or be of a specialised long boot design.

Stirrups and other equipment

Stirrups should be 2-3cm wider than the riders boot whilst mounted. A foot caught in a stirrup can result in dragging, and Safety Stirrups should be considered for children and novice riders. All other horse equipment must be of a safe standard and in good working condition.

Always exercise Caution

Caution must always be exercised around horses, especially the hind legs, which are well designed for kicking. Children must not play in the vicinity of horses. Parents and guardians must ensure they are kept well separated. Riders and handlers should exercise extreme caution when riding in the presence of objects that could frighten the horse. Care should also be taken in the warm up area.
