CONDITIONS OF ENTRY

- Animals for Judging.** Will be accepted from 9.00am to 10.00pm on THURSDAY 25 February, and from 6.00am to 8.30am on FRIDAY 26 February **ONLY**. ANY EXHIBITOR WHO IS UNABLE TO ARRIVE WITHIN THE STIPULATED TIMES MUST MAKE PRIOR ARRANGEMENTS WITH THE CHIEF STEWARD IN ORDER THAT ARRANGEMENTS CAN BE MADE TO INSPECT AND PEN THE ANIMALS.
- ALL ANIMALS** will be inspected by Stewards, prior to penning, for the presence of external parasites e.g. lice, keds or ticks and for soundness of hooves (see paragraph 3 below). If external parasites and/or infectious foot diseases are identified **ALL** animals entered by that exhibitor must be returned to the vehicle/trailer and leave the Showground immediately. A Veterinarian Officer or Steward may examine animals during the course of the Show. If an animal(s) is found to be infected by external parasites and/or infectious foot diseases then all animals entered by that exhibitor must be removed from the Showground immediately. A Veterinary Officer is in attendance throughout the period of the Show and can be contacted through the RNCAS Office.
- Foot rot** - Exhibitors will be required to provide certification on the Declaration Form to the effect that their animal entries are free from Foot rot. This certification will be required to be made by either a Government Veterinarian, a Private Veterinarian or by the Exhibitor in person, in the form of a Statutory Declaration made in the presence of a Justice of the Peace. It is expected that this requirement will be applicable to all Shows in NSW.
- Johnes Disease** - Please see enclosed Johnes Disease forms.
- Entry Applications (Animals)** - Dairy, Angora, Boer and Cashmere Goats.
Specific identification of each animal entered must be given on the Entry Application Form plus a specific Foot rot/Johnes Disease Free Declaration. To be submitted by 4.30pm Monday 18 January 2010. No substitutions will be accepted.
- Restriction of Entries.** If the overall number of entries received exceeds the total accommodation and penning available RNCAS reserves the right to restrict the number of entries to be accepted. Any such restriction of entries will be notified to the relevant exhibitors, together with a refund of entry fees concerned, at least two weeks before the Show. Exhibitors should not, therefore, restrict their entries in any way.

Reserve Champions. When judging Reserve Champions the animal or exhibit placed second to the Champion will be brought forward.
- Ownership.** All animals and exhibits must be the bonafide property of the exhibitor.
- Angora Goats** must be white and eligible for registration by Mohair Australia Ltd. and must be indelibly tattooed in the ear with an identification number in accordance with the registration requirements of Mohair Australia Limited.
- Angora Fleece Length.** In accordance with the established policy of Mohair Australia Limited, all adult Angora Goats i.e. 12 months and over at the 26 February 2010, must have been clean shorn to a maximum average length of 1 cm after 1st August 2009. Exhibitors must enter the shearing date on the Entry Application Form or Entry Confirmation Form for each animal and sign the form. Animals displaying excess length of fleece may be disqualified at the discretion of the Chief Steward.
- Exhibit Handlers.** Exhibitors may hold their own animals or select handlers from a pool of stewards.
- Dairy Goats** must carry a legible tattoo mark and number or microchip.
- Boer Goats** Copy of Registration Certificate (BGBAA) to be supplied for all animals entered and must be submitted with Entry Application Form or entries will not be accepted. Tattoo will be inspected prior to judging and must match submitted registration forms. Animals without a legible tattoo will not be eligible for exhibit.
- Penning** - Animals must be placed **ONLY** in the pens allocated for them by the Committee and as indicated by the Stewards. Unauthorised persons are not permitted to handle animals or exhibits. The Committee reserves the right to change the allocation of pens and, if necessary, to move animals without the owner being present.

15. The Committee reserves the right to divide or amalgamate classes as necessary.
16. During judging handlers are to wear appropriate clothing or a dust coat which must not show exhibitors names or stud identification markings.
17. **Grand Parades.** Champion and Reserve Champion Goats are to take part in the Grand Parades and are to be sashed and available with handlers by 3.30 pm on SATURDAY and 2.00pm on SUNDAY. Angora, Boer, Dairy and Cashmere Goats will be driven on suitable vehicles. Handlers are to wear appropriate clothing or dust coats (which may carry stud markings) and to be otherwise suitably attired during the Carlton & United Breweries Grand Parades (including hats). Water bottles and sun cream is suggested.
18. **Presentation of Trophies and Prizes.** At the completion of the Grand Parade on Sunday.
19. Access for stock vehicles and trailers will be through the Northern Car Park - **GATE 7**. Stock vehicles and trailers are to be parked near the Cattle Vehicles in the marked area in the Northern Car Park to the north of the Dog Section area. When unloading or loading animals vehicles should be driven to the front of the Goat Shed. Load/Unload passes must be visible on entry/exit or vehicles will not be admitted onto the showground. **Boer goats** will be weighed on inspection before proceeding to pens.
20. Animals must remain in their pens until after 5.00 pm SUNDAY. Stock vehicles will not be permitted to enter the Showground to collect animals until after 5.00 pm on SUNDAY. Unauthorised early removal of animals from pens is contrary to the Conditions of Entry. The Committee reserves the right to take action against any exhibitor whose animals or exhibits are removed without the authority of the Chief Steward or her delegate prior to 5.00 pm SUNDAY. **EXHIBITORS WISHING TO DEPART BEFORE 5PM MUST MAKE ARRANGEMENTS WITH THE CHIEF STEWARD PRIOR TO THE COMMENCEMENT OF THE SHOW, AND PERMISSION MAY BE GRANTED AT HER DISCRETION.**
21. Any protest must be made to the Chief Steward or her delegate. Protests must be lodged by 4.30 pm on the day of occurrence. Each protest must be in writing and accompanied by a fee of \$20, which will be forfeited at the discretion of the Committee, if the protest is considered to be frivolous. The reason for any protest must be clearly stated. All protests will be considered by the Chief Steward and such other Committee Members and Stewards as the Chief Steward considers to -be appropriate.
22. **By-Laws.** All Exhibitors accept that they are bound by the By-Laws of the Royal National Capital Agricultural Society and the Conditions of Entry listed in back of this schedule.
23. If due to unforeseen circumstances sponsorship is not forthcoming for classes in which prize-money or prizes are sponsored such awards will not be allocated by the RNCAS.
24. **STUD SIGNS AND ADVERTISING LOGOS NOT TO BE DISPLAYED ON THE DAY OF COMPETITION UNTIL AFTER JUDGING IS COMPLETED.**
25. **Ribbons**

26. **Prize money:** All prize money is GST inclusive. Prize money will be available for collection after the Trophy Presentation.
27. **Gate Passes:** 1 to 5 entries = 2 passes, 6 to 12 entries = 3 passes, 13 to 19 = 4 passes etc.
28. **Additional Passes:** Passes can be purchased at gate for \$20 per adult, \$10 per child.
29. **PENNING ALLOCATION** will be based solely on the number of animals entered in the show. Animals will be checked against the entry forms at the time of admission to the pavilion, and those not entered will not be admitted. Details of your allocated number of pens will be provided with your confirmation of entries received, load/unload and admission passes. Exhibitors with a strong case for exceptions to this rule must contact the Chief Goat Steward and make their case at the time of entry, no last minute changes will be accepted.

 - Can Schools please provide a list indicating entry numbers by the week of 15 February 2010.
- Groups:** Competitors will be divided into groups based on the numbers and ages of the entrants and the type of animals entered.

More than one Breed (Angora, Boer, Cashmere and Dairy) may be judged by each entrant.

1st, 2nd and 3rd Ribbons SPONSORED BY CARRINGTON VIEW AND KIABE
BOER GOAT STUDS.

NOTE: The Competition will be conducted in the same way as previous shows. Heats will be organised according to competitors' ages and choices. It is likely that White Angora and Dairy Classes will be first, with Boer/Meat Classes after the conclusion of Boer Open & Group Classes.

PRESENTATIONS

EXHIBITION BY-LAWS

1. The Show will be open to the public at 8.30am each day.
2. All exhibits to be on the ground not later than when specified in the schedule.
3. All exhibits must be the bona fide property of exhibitors - No two or more exhibitors shall exhibit co-jointly unless they are actual partners.
4. All Entries:
 - a. Must be made in writing on forms supplied by the Society and be accompanied by entry fees and
 - b. must be lodged with the Secretary prior to the closing date for entries as specified in the schedule.
 - c. Entries received after the closing date as specified in the schedule, or received unaccompanied by the specified entry fees will not be accepted.
 - d. Telephone entries are not acceptable.

ENTRY FEES ARE NOT REFUNDABLE UNLESS SPECIFIED IN CONDITIONS OF ENTRY

5. Age for Junior Classes shall deemed to be as at the first day of the Show, 26 February 2010.
6. The Society shall not be responsible for the loss or for any damage or injury occasioned to any exhibit or the property of any exhibitor from any cause whatsoever.
7. The Board of the Society or the Chief Executive Officer shall have the power without assigning any reason to:
 - (i) Reject or cancel any entry any time.
 - (ii) Prohibit the participation by any person or exhibit in any event or class for which it is entered.
 - (iii) Cancel any event or class.
 - (iv) Alter the time at which any class or event is to take place.
 - (v) Alter the conditions of any event.
 - (vi) Remove any exhibit from the Showground.
 - (vii) Alter the date or time for the closing of entries for any section or class or for any particular entry.
 - (viii) Transfer an exhibit or exhibitor from any class to any other class.
8. Proved wilful misrepresentation of exhibits will not merely forfeit the prize, but render the exhibitor liable to be disqualified from exhibiting at future Shows of the Society. The onus of proof as to the bonafides will rest upon the exhibitor.
9. The exhibitors enter entirely at their own risk. In case any exhibit whilst on the Society Showgrounds shall cause or be the cause of injury or damage to any other exhibit or exhibitor or to the personal property of any member of the Society or the general public, the owner of such exhibit shall indemnify and keep indemnified the Society, its officers, officials and members from and against all damages, costs, claims, expenses or liabilities incurred in connection with such exhibits. The exhibitor shall be liable to the Society and its employees, officers and officials for any damage or loss occasioned to any of them by the exhibit or the exhibitor or his agent.
10. The exhibitor shall at all times comply with the directions or requests of the Board of the Society or of its Chief Executive Officer. This shall without limiting the generality of the foregoing apply to the entry, the animal, the exhibitor, the conditions of the event, the conduct of the exhibitor, the conducting of the event, the decisions of the Judge and the awarding of the prize.
11. The Board of the Society or the Chief Executive Officer reserve the right to adjudicate on any entry or upon any question in dispute or doubt and to make any determination upon any matter whether covered by the conditions of entry or not and the decision so made shall be final & binding & the Society shall thereby have sole and absolute control of all matters affecting the conduct of the Show & the exhibits & exhibitors. There shall be no right of appeal to any court of law or other body from any decision made by the Board of the Society or the CEO.
12. If, in the opinion of the Judges, an exhibit is improperly classed, it may be removed by the stewards and placed in its proper class. If the exhibitor objects to such removal, the exhibit may be disqualified.
13. OFFENSIVE BEHAVIOUR: All persons causing annoyance by;
 - a. Making loud comments, or by other offensive behaviour, on the decisions of Judges, Stewards or other officials; or
 - b. The use of swearing or foul language will after being cautioned by a member of Council or Chief Executive Officer, be expelled from the ground and if a competitor, be liable for disqualification and forfeiture of any prize money won.
14. The use of loud speakers and radio broadcast appliances of every description shall be permitted only with the written authority of the CEO.
15. Removal of exhibits. No exhibit other than livestock may be removed from the Showground until 8.30 pm on the third day of the Show, except with the written authority of the Chief Executive Officer.
16. No advertising matter of any description will be permitted on competitive exhibits.
17. Correct and full postal address to be placed on entry forms.
18. Financial members may claim 20% reduction on total entry fees where total of entry fees are \$10 or more, or as outlined in the Conditions of Entry.
19. Any protest must be made to the Chief Steward or delegate. Protest must be lodged by 4.30pm on the day of occurrence. Each protest must be in writing and accompanied by a fee of \$20 which will be forfeited, at the discretion of the Committee, if the protest is considered to be frivolous. The reason for any protest must be clearly stated. All protest will be considered by the Chief Steward and such other Committee Members and Stewards as the Chief Steward considered to be appropriate.
20. All monetary prizes will be paid by the Society during the Show. Instructions on prize cards must be observed. Prize money unclaimed by 17 March 2010 will be forfeited.
21. Restrictions or limitations on the number of entries in any Section may be made by the Chief Executive Officer of the Society.
22. Where an exhibitor fails to secure properly any animal and or exhibit, and bodily injury or property damage occurs this may constitute a serious breach of insurance policy conditions and may prejudice claims settlement.
23. If due to unforeseen circumstances sponsorship is not forthcoming for classes in which the prize-money is sponsored, prize-money will not be paid by the RNCAS.
24. CANCELLATION OF THE SHOW FOR ANY REASON
It is agreed between the parties that, if in the sole discretion of the Board or the Chief Executive Officer or some other authorised officer that the Show is to be partially or fully cancelled for any reason whatsoever, the exhibitor shall not pursue the Society for the recoveries of lost income or damages. This complete bar to an action applies to all headings of Law, whether it be Common Law in Contract or Tort or pursuant to any State, Territorial, or Commonwealth Statute Law. It is acknowledged by the exhibitor that the Society has no duty to have a Show in any particular year and that this Clause operates as a complete defence for the Society to any such action.
